

of God's presence pouring out and bringing renewal wherever it goes. We are called as "portable temples of God" in the midst of this time of separation and danger to bring hope, restoration and joy wherever we go. "

" 'Where you stand is where you worship.' I'd like to think I live this out, but why was this phrase from the sermon so striking to me? What does that mean to how I actually think about worship and places of worship? Yes, I miss worshipping with my church and in my church building—the sound of others' voices and the music from the band covering me as I join in song, the sense of presence of other Villagers around me praying at the same time, the audible, group, "Amen." But I worship God all day, all the time, in all situations, right? So why is this phrase sticking with me so much? Maybe I haven't thought about how much I need worship outside of my church building experience, maybe I'm like the Israelites in exile, waiting until they can get back to the temple one day. God was gracious and saw they needed to be encouraged, to have hope, to worship. God told Ezekiel not to wait, that the temple is all around as His presence is is all around. I do believe God's "life giving presence" is all around me, in the beauty of my daily life. He is so worthy of my praise. So I must worship from where I stand."
