## Sharing and Listening Guide

Take some time alone or with a small group to discuss the following questions based on today's sermon:

- Think back to two weeks ago when Pastor Paul first introduced the new ministry directives with his sermon on being a "Community in Christ." Read John 13:34-35 again and discuss what authentic relationships in a community in Christ means to you, how it challenges you.
- Today's sermon takes us to a second ministry directive, to be a "Missional Community in Christ." How have you defined living missionally, being "on mission?" How was that the same or different from Pastor John Jordan's explanation?

- For some of us, being on mission, living missionally, is confusing and difficult. Discuss or journal why this might be the case for you and turn that into a prayer of open dialogue with God. Everyone, please pray that we all step into this invitation in faith
