Village Vaccination Clinics – Volunteers Needed

Did you know over 2000 people have been vaccinated at Village? The vaccination clinics have been conducted in partnership with Washington County Health Services and the City of Beaverton. For the next 3 clinics the County has asked Village to fill all the clinic positions with our own volunteers. To run a clinic, it takes about 50 volunteers including traffic flow, intake, paperwork, syringe fillers, vaccinators, observers, and translators. This is a unique opportunity for our church to offer a valuable service to the people in our community. We hope you will join other Villagers in making these events a success in not just the number of vaccinations, but in the quality of care and the kind welcome people receive while on our campus.

Jeremiah 29:1-14 Guest Speaker Scot Keranen – Hope for Exiles in the New Babylon

Sharing and Listening Guide

Take some time alone or with a small group to discuss the following questions based on today's sermon:

- According to the message this weekend, what are some values principles in the Kingdom of God? (Acts 1:8; John 18:36; Jeremiah 29:5-7,11-12; 1 Timothy 2:2-4)
- How can you (as an individual and/or life group) work intentionally for the peace & prosperity of your community/city?
- Do you believe God's promises are still valid today? How might you need to trust the Lord more or are there areas of your life you need to surrender to the Lord today?
- Are there ways in which you are encountering persecution or opposition to your faith? How might we pray today for those who oppose God in your community? (Matthew 5:43-44)

Responsive Worship

We have inquired how we as a community can best worship in this time of COVID, where we, instead of watching, can participate in our services, with as much engagement as possible. Our worship response is both personal and corporate–communal. Our online services have aimed to share the hearts of our Villagers, especially while we are physically distanced.

The following are in response to last week's sermon: **The Empowering Presence**

"Dear Lord, help me to walk beside you always looking to you for guidance in kingdom living. Help me to see others through your eyes with love. Always listening to you. I love you Lord and always want others to see that. Thank you, Lord."

"Thank you Father; I've always known there was a "spirit" in me, around me, and working through me. The sermon today confirmed it has been you all along; Thank you for always being there even when I can't explain it... I just feel it; that is the true blessing... you are so real. Amen!"

"Do not eat from the tree of good and evil means do not judge what is good and what is wrong, or not good for you. Let God drive. He knows what is best for you. Do not question your path, but let God. Last week's message; among other details: judgement isn't a big stick from Him at death, but what path you lay by sin, by nature, will be dealt to you in this life. Holy Spirit = The spirit of Jesus himself. Seek his presence and guidance. *Goin back to my Galilee is to live out the Kingdom of God in this Life."
