DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Ken talked about Psalm 29 as being entirely praise for God. Does reading Psalm 29 encourage you; and, if so, in what ways?
- 2. Psalm 29 begins and ends with much the same language that the angels used when they announced Jesus's birth do the shepherds. Ken referred to Psalm 29 as a form of presenting the gospel. What do you find



- interesting about this connection? What light could it shed on some of the circumstances you may be facing or questions you may be asking today?
- 3. Psalm 29 historically was sung to people during thunderstorms. What reminders about the character of God do you think might be reassuring in some of the storms we're facing today?
