DONATION CENTER CHANGES

Thank you for your donations to the Distribution Center! This week we are transitioning the oversight of the Distribution Center from the City of Beaverton to a Village-run ministry. New this week, our Hispanic Fellowship is partnering with the Oregon Food Bank and our Village Distribution Center to distribute food to several migrant camps each week. In addition, they are providing food for approximately 244 people in one camp with which they have an on-going partnership. Currently, due to COVID-19 concerns, no other groups are being allowed contact with the migrant workers.

We have also been in contact with the WIC office in Hillsboro who is serving migrant communities as well and they are in need of baby supplies and food as there are a few women who are due soon but have very little supplies. See the needs listed below.

Immediate Needs: Diapers, wipes, baby food, baby bottles, general baby supplies, baby clothes for newborn and under 12 months, toilet paper, paper towels, face masks, lysol wipes, shampoo & conditioner, toothbrushes, toothpaste, bath soap, hand soap, wash cloths, dish soap, clothing detergent, dish towels, hand sanitizer.

Exodus 6:6-9; 19:5-6

SENDING

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

This Sunday, we are reflecting on the overall confrontation between God and Pharaoh. In this confrontation, God's love, compassion, and willingness to act on behalf of an oppressed people shines forth. The saving acts of God define the Israelites for every generation that follows. Yet in the midst of the miraculous, the story reveals the fickleness of the human heart and in many ways, the battle for loyalty still wages on.

1. What stands out to you in this passage? What is surprising? What is encouraging? What is worrying?
2. How does the use of the word 'redeem' in Exodus shape our understanding of Jesus' work to redeem us?
3. What ways does the biblical narrative of God confronting Pharaoh apply to us today? How does our understanding of the gospel relate to our fidelity and loyalty to Jesus? Are there areas in your life where you need to renew your allegiance to Jesus?



4. Considering the role of the priests in Israel, what is Peter trying to communicate regarding our roles as followers of Christ in 1 Peter 2:9?
5. How can reflection and research act as way of repentance and resistance against the values of the empire?
