DONATION CENTER

Thank you for your donations to the Distribution Center! In recent weeks we have helped approximately 150 refugee families in addition to many more people helped through the non-profits we are servicing.

This week the Distribution Center is transitioning from the oversight of the City of Beaverton to a Village-run center. Next week we are providing food for refugees who are single, single parents, and those who are physically challenged and were unable to come to previous pick-up events.

We have heard from a few that are needing to raise support and connect with donors but with travel restrictions are unsure of how or when they will be able to accomplish it. Pray for their funding, safety, and ministries.
- Continue to pray for the Distribution Center as it transitions from City of Beaverton oversight to a Villagerun ministry. We have been making distributions of food and supplies to approximately 70 *different* families each week with more groups asking for assistance. The center is serving non-profit organizations working with populations of refugees, immigrants, homeless and seniors in our community.
- Pray for Village's new incarceration ministry as we partner with Know Me Now in providing New Beginning Bags through our life groups and Connection Kits this summer through Village Kids' families. As we care for families and those who work in the prison system, we can demonstrate God's love and compassion to those who need encouragement and hope.
