- Pray for the distribution scheduled this Friday for refugee families. Pray they will
 experience Village as a safe place and that any barriers of fear toward Christians will be
 dismantled as they encounter love and care for their families through these efforts.
 Village's positive reputation throughout the refugee communities is growing through
 their encounters with the distribution center.
- Pray for our involvement with the migrant camps. We are now collecting hygiene supplies and diapers for migrant workers in Hillsboro. We need hundreds of soap bars, shampoo, dish soap, Lysol wipes, disposable shavers, toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc. These are things people need but are not receiving from other organizations. This effort is in partnership with Washington County Services.
- Pray for our Covid Task Force as they diligently monitor safety for our eventual return to the sanctuary. Plans are made but change as our rates of Covid 19 infection continue to impact our ability to gather. Pray for our people who are missing worshipping together. Zoom and video services can be great for some, but distracting and not enough for others.
- Pray for the safety of our Villagers as small groups begin to meet on campus again. Life groups, study groups and small groups are using our opened our sanctuary building to be able to meet face to face in a more open space than their homes.

Invitation to Trust
Exodus 16

Gratitude or grumbling? The nation of Israel is put to the test again for God to provide. The promises of God to give bread from heaven and His promises are fulfilled. Despite the miraculous interventions by God that characterized their escape from Egypt, the people do not really trust him; the first bit of hardship turns to whining and complaining. Exodus 16 carries the story further and we see Israel getting a few things right; it also reveals what is in their heart.

God also provides something new, Sabbath. This was the first time God spoke to Israel about the Sabbath. God essentially invited them to honor the Sabbath by not providing any bread from heaven on the Sabbath day. Again, another way to test what was in their hearts and trust God to provide.

The story in Exodus 16 helps us understand God's purposes, provision and helps us trust the story
